

If you have access to the internet, we will be webcasting this service live from Cumberland Lodge at **11.00 am each Sunday**, and we invite you to join us using this order of service. The service will last approximately 15 to 20 minutes.

If you do not have access to the internet, we invite you to join us by using this order of service, at 11.00 am on Sunday if possible. You might like to know that at the start of each service we will light a candle, and you may wish to do so as well.
