You can hire our beautiful facilities and grounds for residential or non-residential conferences, meetings, away-days, and special events such as weddings, throughout the year.

We work to provide a setting that's equally intellectually and professionally stimulating, as well as welcoming, thoughtful, and inspiring. Our spaces enable your guests to interact with one another in ways that aren't necessarily possible elsewhere.

Located less than 30 miles outside of London, we're both remote and accessible, offering tranquil surroundings that can be easily reached via good transport connections.

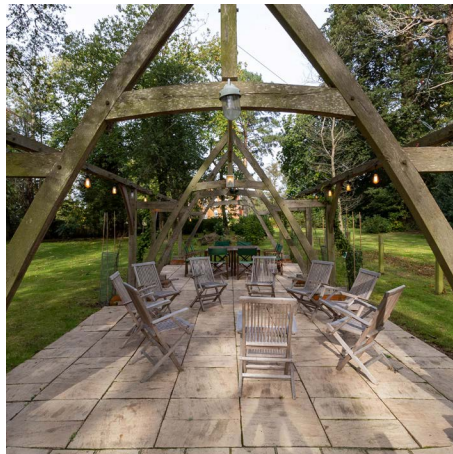
## Perfectly located

Venues in Windsor are hugely in demand, and it's no wonder considering how beautiful and steeped in history the town is. Both Windsor Castle and the Magna Carta memorial at Runnymede are less than five miles away.

We're nestled in the heart of Windsor Great Park, an ancient royal landscape of forests, grasslands, lakes, and gardens. With nearly 5,000 acres of outdoor space, the Park offers beautiful views year-round for you to explore.

Cumberland Lodge is well located for national and international meetings. We are just 20 minutes from London Heathrow, 15 minutes from regular train services to London Waterloo and Paddington (via Windsor and Egham railway stations), and 15 minutes from the M25, M4, and M3 motorways. For those travelling to us by car, there is plenty of free parking on site.

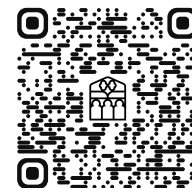




## Elegant spaces

We offer a range of indoor and outdoor spaces for socialising or quiet relaxation. The elegant Drawing Room is perfect for receptions and recitals, while our Tapestry Hall, featured in *The King's Speech* (2010), offers a cosy winter retreat by the fire. The underground Vaults provide lively evening entertainment with a projector, disco lighting, and sound system. Outdoors, guests can enjoy dining areas, secluded benches, and our Wilderness space.

Our facilities include 58 bedrooms, 14 meeting rooms, three dining rooms, and outside spaces. The main Lodge houses most guest bedrooms and some meeting rooms, while The Mews offers larger conference rooms with breakout rooms and additional bedrooms. Groom's House, a 17th-century retreat with a kitchen, seven bedrooms, and a sitting room, can be hired exclusively for small groups. Our team ensures every event is tailored to your needs.

## Meeting rooms

Our flexible meeting spaces suit a range of requirements, from smaller team meetings and away-days to larger residential conferences.

Situated in The Mews, Flitcroft is our largest meeting room and main conference facility. It holds up to 100 people in theatre layout, and there are two adjoining breakout rooms, ideal for small group work. Flitcroft is well equipped with AV/IT facilities.

The Amy Buller Library is an ideal setting for boardroom-style meetings of up to 25 people. Situated in the main Lodge, it offers beautiful views across our garden and out into Windsor Great Park.

Also situated in The Mews, Sandby is a large meeting room that can accommodate up to 50 people in theatre layout.

All of our meeting spaces are flexible and can be arranged to suit your needs.

## Staying with us

Our location in the heart of Windsor Great Park lets you get away from the noise of the city, perfect for a relaxing night's sleep.

We have 58 double and twin bedrooms available, accomodating up to 95 guests overnight.

Each bedroom has a writing desk, in case you're feeling inspired by the sweeping parkland views, and an en-suite bathroom.

Although WiFi is freely available across our site, rooms are purposefully designed to be 'low-tech', offering you and your guests an opportunity to escape from screens and make the most of our tranquil setting.

The Cumberland Lodge site is accessible to wheelchair users and visitors with additional accessibility needs. Two bedrooms feature adapted bathrooms, and we can accomodate carers in adjacent rooms.

We also have family-friendly rooms that can accommodate babies and toddlers.





## Dining with us

Dining is central to the Cumberland Lodge experience. We offer locally-sourced cuisine served across three dining spaces.

Our largest dining rooms combine to seat up to 100 guests, while the Princess Helena dining room provides an intimate setting with garden views.

In summer months, you can enjoy al-fresco lunches on our main lawn with sheltered picnic tables overlooking the Great Park. We also have a licensed bar featuring a special Windsor & Eton Brewery beer and alcohol-free options.

## Our history

Originally known as Byfield House, the site of Cumberland Lodge was first built upon in the republican era in the 17th century, after the English Civil War. Following the monarchy's restoration, the Lodge became home to the Rangers of the Great Park, named after the Duke of Cumberland, son of King George II.

After falling vacant in 1947, King George VI granted use of the Lodge to our charity, founded by Amy Buller, author of *Darkness Over Germany*, which explores the rise of Nazism and the importance of respectful dialogue during times of conflict and change.

Amy Buller was introduced to Queen Elizabeth, and invited to Buckingham Palace to discuss her work. Impressed, the King and Queen offered Buller the Lodge for an educational foundation. It has been our home ever since.

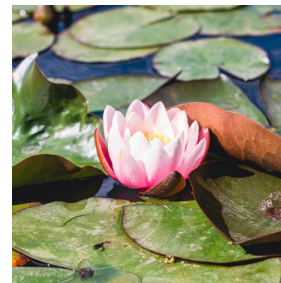
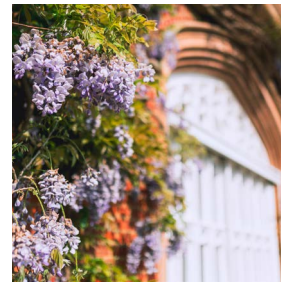
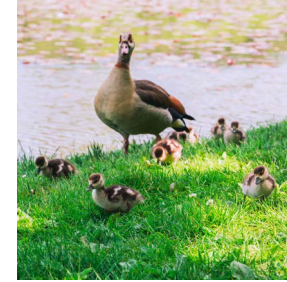
